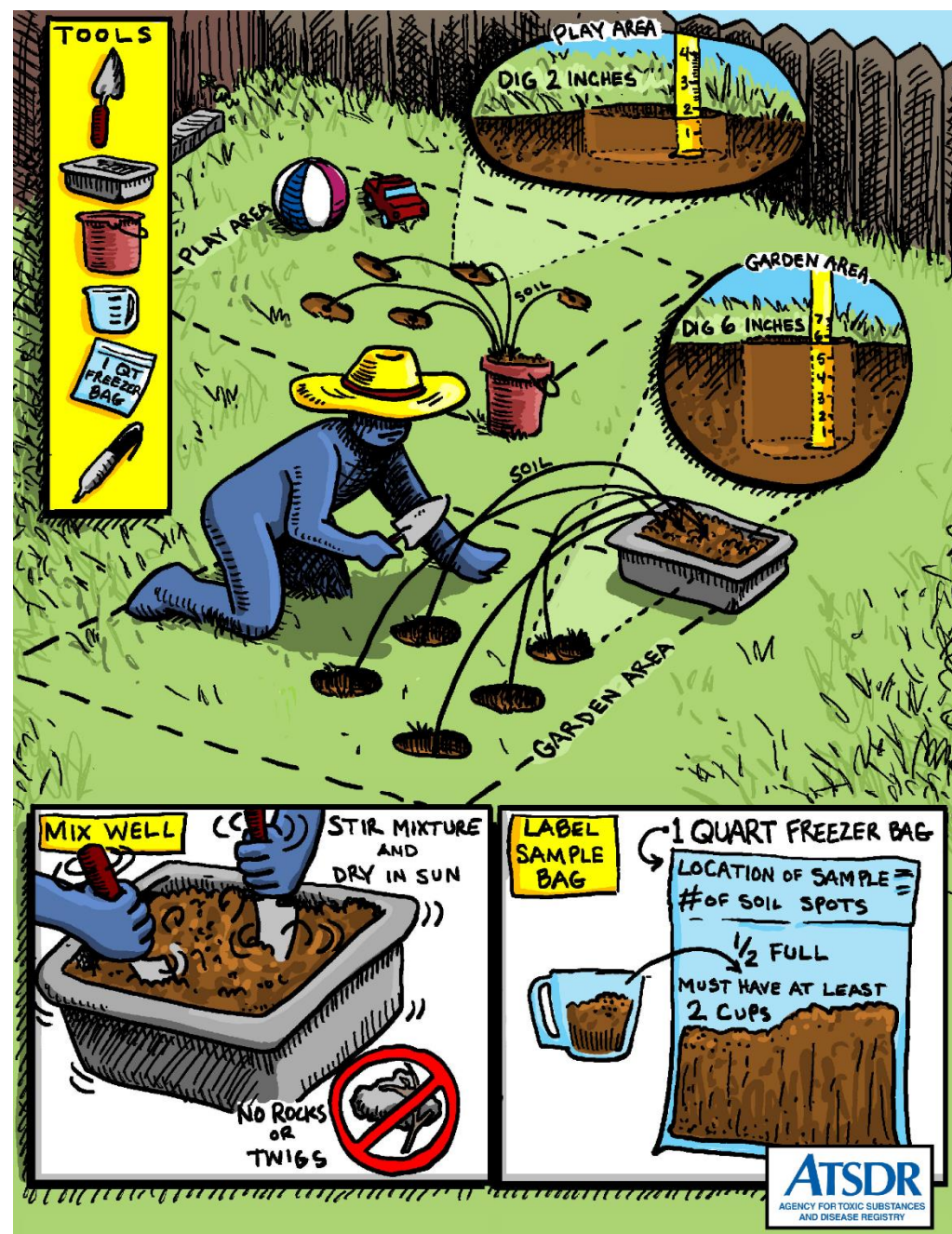

Collect a Soil Sample in Six Easy Steps

- 1. Identify area of interest such as a garden or play area.**
- 2. Wear gloves. Collect soil and combine in clean container.**
 - For large area collect soil from 5-10 random spots
 - For small area collect soil from 3 random spots
 - Garden area dig 6-8 inches deep
 - Play area dig 1-2 inches deep
 - If present, do not dig below remediation fabric
- 3. Mix soil well.**
- 4. Remove pebbles, rocks, and roots. Air dry in sun.
Do not use flame, oven, or hair dryer.**
- 5. Transfer 1-2 cups of mixed soil into a one-quart Ziploc bag (about half full).
Label location on bag.**
- 6. Wash hands.**

For more than one sample repeat steps 1-5. Rinse container between samples.
